
COVID Vaccine

Current Update


- COVID 19 vaccination doses administered per 100 people
 - India: 0.27 (19% of phase 1 targeted population)
 - UAE: 31.49UK: 13.95Europe: 3.14
- Total 30 million people to be vaccinated in phase 1: healthcare worker (10 MN) and frontline workers (20 MN)
- Another total 270 million people above 50 and those below 50 with co-morbidities to be vaccinated in phase 1
- As on February 10, 2021, 7.017 million* people were administered the vaccine in India as per GOI guidelines.
- The current inoculation count is approx. 300K per day. With aggressive drive strategy, the GOI target plans to inoculate 500K people per day. At this pace, administration of both the doses will finish between May-June
- GOI has allocated 350 BN towards COVID vaccination budget at an estimated per person spend of INR 700 (Vaccine cost + transportation + administration)
- This budget can cover 500 million of India's population
- Covishield and Covaxin have shown 62% efficacy in phase 1

Mode of Administration



Private Purchase

GOI may allow private purchase of vaccine to individuals like any other vaccine at a later date



Designated Centers

GOI can make the vaccine available at designated centers only. Individuals to book appointments through app and get the vaccine administrated



Parallel Govt Schemes

GOI can drive giving vaccine at government centers free of cost like pulse polio scheme with parallel private access
